### **Reading Road Map- Year Six**




The children in Year Six have been taking part in a Reading scheme run by Essex Library Services. The reading challenge is based on a map of an area featuring roads that children will be familiar with. Each road represents a genre: Adventure; Classics; Crime; Fantasy & Sci-FI; Graphic Novels; Horror; Humour; Poetry; Sport and Non-Fiction. Children are encouraged to travel the roads reading a range of titles selected from the 60 books. Each title is marked with a green, yellow or red dot indicating the level of challenge meaning it is accessible to all abilities.

Well done to the Year Six girls who have read their first five books of the Reading Challenge and achieved their first certificate. Fantastic effort!

### Year 5 Road Safety Pedestrian Training
